

These sanctions have frequently targeted South-South cooperation, obstructing not only economic ties but also cultural exchange and tourism between developing nations. In this context, relying on Global Northdominated airlines and routes makes

To address these challenges, the development of a Global South Air Transport Belt is essential. Such a network would establish direct routes between countries in South America, Africa, and Asia, reducing their dependency on Northern air corridors. This independent system would be more resilient to the sanctions and geopolitical machinations of the Global North, ensuring that tourism, economic exchange, and cultural integration can continue unhindered. By creating their own air transport corridors, Global South countries can secure a vital link for sustainable tourism growth and foster stronger regional cooperation.

One of the most significant contributions of tourism to peace is its ability to promote cultural exchange. Travelers are exposed to different ways of life, traditions, and values, broadening their perspectives and fostering a greater appreciation for diversity. This exchange can lead to a reduction in xenophobia and stereotypes as people learn to see beyond their cultural lens. International tourism correlates with improved diplomatic relations between countries by fostering mutual understanding and soft diplomacy. Furthermore, tourism often acts as informal diplomacy, with tourists becoming ambassadors of their countries, facilitating people-to-people diplomacy and ostering goodwill.

The economic benefits of tourism also contribute to peace and stability in many regions. By generating income and creating jobs, tourism helps lift communities out of poverty and reduces socio-economic inequalities. A study by Vítová, Harmáček and Opršal 2019) on small island developing states (SIDS) demonstrated how tourism-driven economic growth can reduce socio-political tensions by improving livelihoods. Likewise, a 2018 study by Manhas,

Hussain, Kumar, and Sharma on tourism in Jammu and Tourism has long been recognised as a powerful tool for Kashmir highlights the importance of tourism in promoting peace and tranquillity in conflict-sensitive regions. The study reveals that tourism in sacred sites of Jammu and Kashmir has significantly contributed to fostering communal harmony united global and generating socio-economic benefits for local populations, which in turn helps in mitigating conflicts. In areas that rely heavily on tourism, the industry can act as a buffer against economic downturns, providing a stable source of revenue.

> This, in turn, fosters collaboration between nations as they work together to promote tourism and its associated benefits. However, the potential of tourism to promote peace has its challenges. Overtourism, for example, can strain local resources, lead to environmental degradation, and create conflicts between tourists and residents. When tourism is not managed sustainably, it can commodify cultures, where traditions and heritage are exploited for profit. Additionally, the benefits of tourism are not always equally distributed, with some communities receiving little to no economic gain. leading to feelings of inequality and resentment. In politically unstable regions, such as the Middle East, research by Sönmez (1998) has shown that political instability can significantly reduce tourism demand, leading to a vicious cycle of economic decline and increased tensions.Despite these challenges, the potential for tourism to act as a force for peace remains significant. Tourism can catalyse social and economic development, fostering understanding and reducing conflict when adequately managed. As the world becomes increasingly interconnected, the tourism industry, policymakers, and travellers must work together to ensure that tourism continues to serve as a tool for peace. By
